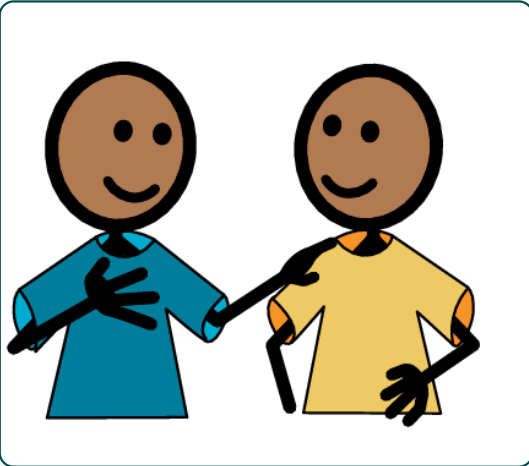
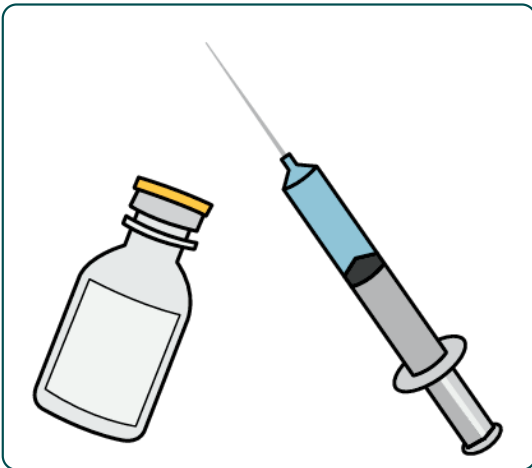


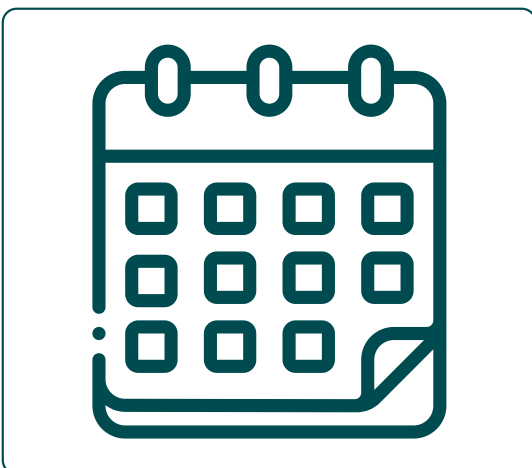
Getting My Vaccine



I want to protect myself and people around me from getting sick.

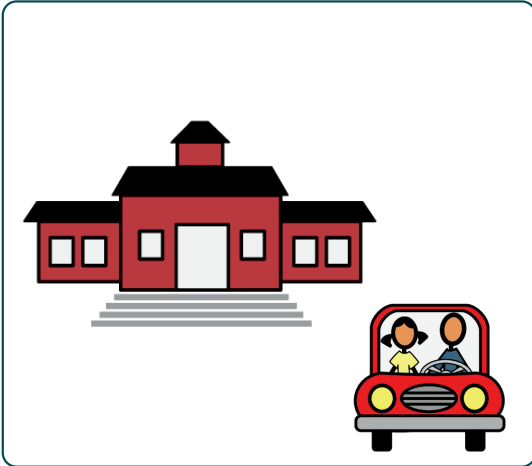


A vaccine is a medicine that protects people from getting sick.

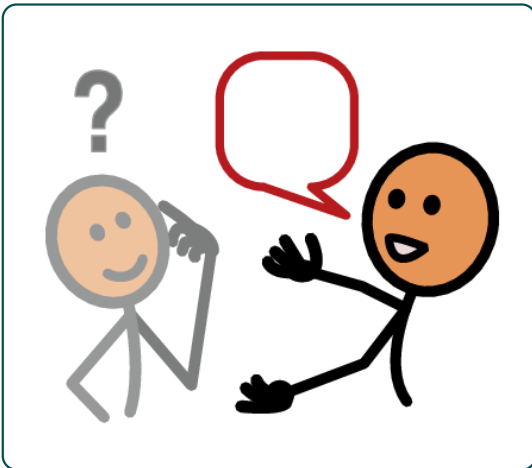


Sometimes you need just one vaccine a year, sometimes you need more depending on the vaccine.

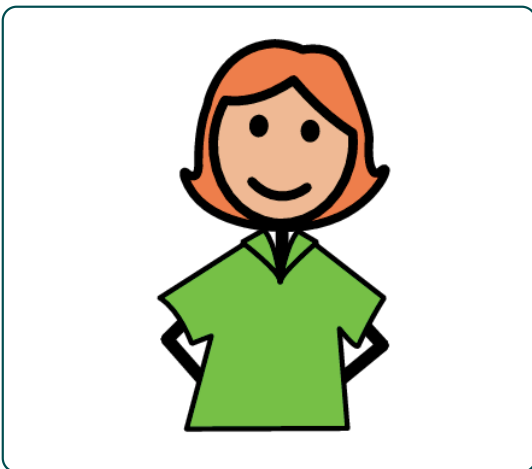
Getting My Vaccine



I can get a vaccine at any pharmacy, doctor, or clinic.

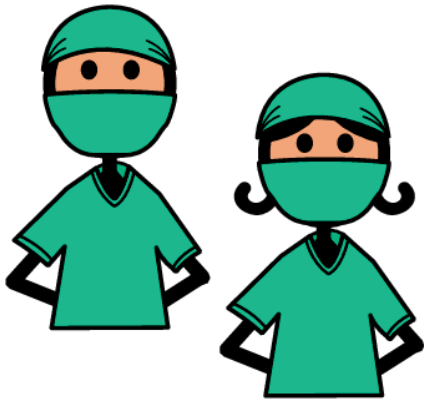


I will go into the building and check in by giving my name, birthday, and answering questions from the helper.



My family can help me check in. A helper will show me where to go. I will go with the helper and my family.

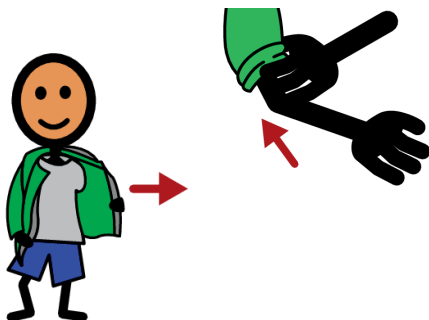
Getting My Vaccine

Even though I can't see their faces, the helpers are very happy to see me.

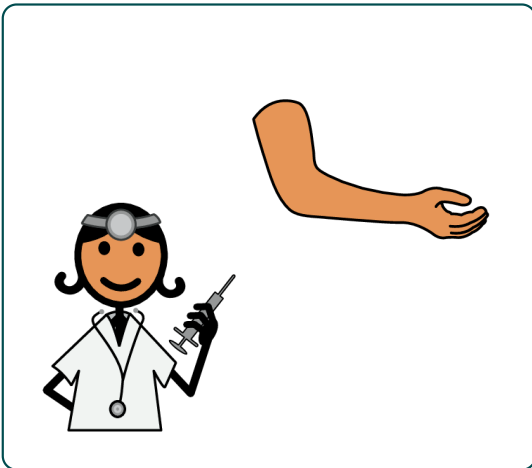


I will roll up my sleeve or take off my jacket when it is my turn.

I will try to stay still.**

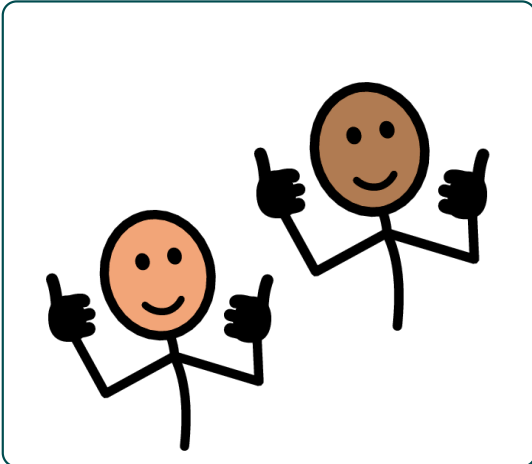


**A nurse will give me the shot.

needle goes into my arm.**

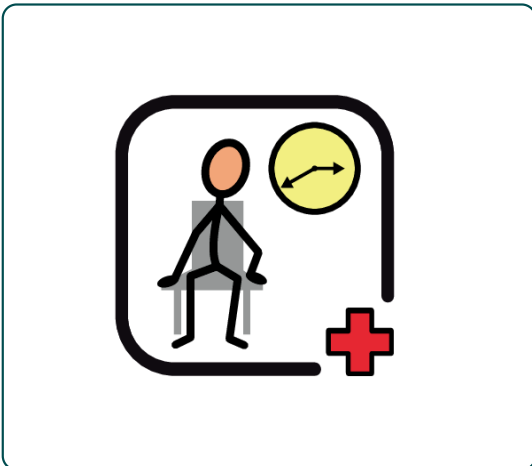


**The nurse will put a band-aid
